Reflection from the Pastor, 8-13-2014

Well, it's been an amazing three years and 3 months of ministry with Geneva! Thanks to the PNC for their hard work and determination to finally bring a candidate in nomination to the congregation. Thanks to everyone for their patience over the last three years through the long interim season and all the things that we experienced together to prepare Geneva for the coming of the next pastor. As the time gets closer for your Pastor Nominating Committee to present their candidate to the people of Geneva on Sunday September 7th, let me reflect on a few questions I have been asked:

First, "Is September 7th the starting date for the new pastor?" No, that is the Sunday when the PNC will introduce to Geneva the candidate and nominee for the position of Pastor/Head of Staff. This candidate will preach and lead worship in all three worship services. Following the 11am worship service there will be a called congregational meeting for the specific purpose of electing the candidate and approving his compensation package. Opportunity will be given for everyone to ask questions of the nominee before he will be dismissed with family members out of the sanctuary. In addition, before the vote, the compensation package will be presented and questions about it will be answered before the congregation will vote to elect the nominee and the vote on his compensation package. Assuming the election of the candidate is positive, he will return to his current



congregation, finish his ministry there, say goodbye and move to Geneva to start ministry sometime in October.

Second, "Do you (Pastor Mike) have a call to another church?" At the time of this writing, I don't. I am actively searching for my next ministry adventure and have talked with a few Interim Pastor Nominating Committees all across the nation. Nothing is serious yet. I will go where God leads me but I am hoping to serve in a church close to home. Joni and I need your prayers for my next ministry assignment to become clear very soon. In 35 years of ministry God has never let me down and I trust him totally for my next ministry. Although my mind is getting a little anxious, my heart is at peace trusting in the Lord's provision for my future. Please pray for us as we make connections and discern next steps in our future.

Third, as the new pastor comes, it is not time to sit back and expect him to do everything. Now will be the time to get involved. A pastor's

ministry is only as good as the church membership's involvement. It's time to join with others and be the Church God has called Geneva to be: a loving, welcoming, mission station that equips its members to go out into the neighborhoods with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. That means it's going to be all hands on deck! Come to Geneva to be filled and inspired to go out into the world for Christ.

That's what you have done for me and Joni. We feel prepared to be sent out by you for our next mission. Join us in prayer for God's guidance over the next few months so that God's will for us will become known just as his will for Geneva is becoming clear. Next month I'll take time to say goodbye, but for now let's celebrate God's provision for Geneva!

Vision Challenges: Low Vision

Due to an increase in the number of aging baby boomers and the growing prevalence of such diseases as diabetes and age-related macular degeneration (AMD), some 61 million Americans are at a high risk of serious vision loss.

Partial vision loss that cannot be corrected causes a vision impairment known as low vision. A person with low vision has severely reduced visual acuity, contrast sensitivity, or a significantly obstructed field of vision —or all three.

Signs of Low Vision:

- Difficulty recognizing a familiar face
- Difficulty reading—print appears broken, distorted or incomplete
- Difficulty seeing objects and potential hazards such as steps, curbs, walls, uneven surfaces and furniture

Low Vision = Useful Vision

People with low vision usually retain some usable vision.

An ophthalmologist or optometrist specializing in low vision can evaluate how you see and prescribe optical devices to maximize your remaining vision. This functional vision assessment is an important step in helping improve your quality of life.

Improving Your Functional Vision with the Help of Devices:

Even with regular eyeglasses or contact lenses, a visual image — whether a sentence from a book or a crosswalk at a busy intersection — may appear distorted, blurred or

incomplete if you have low vision.

A low vision doctor may recommend devices such as magnifiers and tinted lenses to help you take full advantage of the sight you have. Non-optical devices such as large print checks, playing cards, clocks, remote controls, as well as signature and writing guides are also popular. Braille Institute and Lighthouse International are excellent resources for more information on low vision products.

Vision Rehabilitation – The Key to Safety and Independence

If your vision loss can't be corrected by medical or surgical interventions, vision rehabilitation can help. Vision rehabilitation services equip you with skills and strategies to help you remain safe, independent and active at any stage of life.

These services are provided by a multidisciplinary team of professionals who can introduce you to new methods of using remaining vision to help you maximize daily functioning and

adjust to vision loss. This team includes specially trained ophthalmologists, optometrists, social workers, nurses, occupational therapists, vision rehabilitation therapists, career counselors, orientation and mobility specialists, and others.


